Funding is available for up to \$250 per kid each year for subsidizing registration fees for sport programs.

Canadian Tire Jumpstart Program.

Cariboo Jumpstart Program is an affiliate of the Canadian Tire Foundation for Families and provides funding for financially disadvantaged children to participate in arts, scouts, guides, sports and recreational activities, so they develop essential life skills, self esteem and confidence. Funding is available for up to \$300. This program donates approximately \$10,000 each year to assist children in Quesnel register for programs. Leisure Access

This program provides 50% subsidies for children and adults on all public swimming and skating admissions and a 25% subsidy for programs offered by the Arts and Recreation Centre and Twin Arenas. Residents may be eligible for this program if they are receiving income assistance from the Ministry of Social Development and Social Innovation or have a family income of up to \$20,300 (1 person); \$25,375 (2 person family); \$30,450 (3 person family); \$35,525 (4 person family) or for a family of 5 or more (\$40,600). Leisure Access is subsidized by the North Cariboo Parks and Recreation taxation area and is open to area residents only. Apply at the Arts and Recreation Centre.

Remember that everyone over 80 gets free admission to swim and to the gym at the Arts and Recreation Centre or to skate at the Twin Arenas.
